Patsy Orlofsky is the founder and director of The Textile Conservation Workshop. She is well known as an authority in 19th century American textiles. She lectures on American textiles, their history and care, at museums and historical societies throughout New York and New England. She has given seminars on the history of American textiles at a number of universities including Cornell, Yale and the University of California. She is also the author of "Quilts in America."

Patsy will give a slide and talk presentation which will include American textiles such as quilts, woven coverlets and samplers. There will also be time for her to discuss antique quilts belonging to Guild members. So if you have an antique quilt, please bring it to the meeting.

I have heard Patsy speak and I'm very pleased she has agreed to be our guest speaker for the April meeting. So do come.....and bring your antique quilts, coverlets or samplers.

Looking ahead to the May 17th meeting - Dixie Haywood from Pensacola, Florida. Dixie does contemporary crazy quilting and her lecture is called "Crazy Quilting with a Difference." 
