### INSTRUCTIONS FOR QUILT SHOW VOLUNTEERS

The following is some information to ensure that all goes smoothly at *A World of Quilts XXIV*.

#### ADMISSION to the SHOW

Guild members *only* are admitted one hour prior to the 'official' opening of the show - *Saturday at 9:00 am* - giving you an hour of shopping before the crowds arrive. You **must** wear your nametag in order to be admitted early on Saturday, and present your admission pass to the admission desk.

#### SIGN-IN

Please report to the Hospitality Room (the JFK Faculty Lounge, located to the left of the Cafeteria kitchen) to check in. Highlight your name on the sign-up sheet when you arrive.

#### WORKING

Please report to your assignment on time so that the person you are relieving can move on to their next assignment. Volunteers will wear their own NSQG apron or you may borrow an NSQG tabard, available in the Hospitality Room. Please return tabards there when you are finished with your assignment.

#### QUILT WATCHERS

- Please remember that your job is to guard the quilts that are on loan to the Guild. Please do not leave the floor until you are relieved at the end of your shift.
- White gloves for Quilt Watchers will be available and must be worn.
- Touching the quilts by is not permitted. Only Quilt Watchers are allowed to touch and show the backs to viewers; please use care when doing so.
- Food and beverages are not permitted.
- Flash photography is permitted for personal use only.
- Each monitor will be assigned a row of quilts to monitor.
- The Watch Leader will roam the area and will direct a rotation, allowing you to work different rows. The goal is to be spread out with at least one monitor in each row at all time.

## Round Robin Quilts—April

The final border will be added this month. It is your job to pull it all together with a 5" border all around using the colors and design elements of your choice.

At the May meeting give the quilt top back to the original center block maker. You will show off your beautiful work in a group show and tell.

Each of you should quilt and bind the quilt before giving it to Comfort Quilts for distribution to sick and needy children. Machine or hand quilting is acceptable. This is a good opportunity to practice machine quilting—the kids don't know if it is done well or not. The binding can also be put on by machine on both sides. Do finish the corners and overlap seam with a few hand stitches to hold them.

When finished give the quilt to Pat Baker 845.279.8840 or to me.

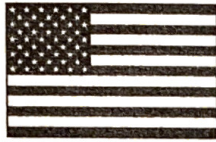
## Houston 2003

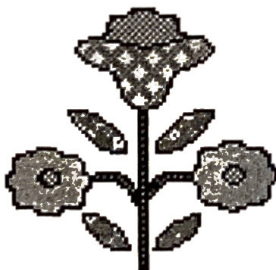

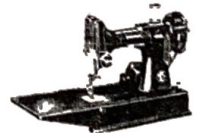

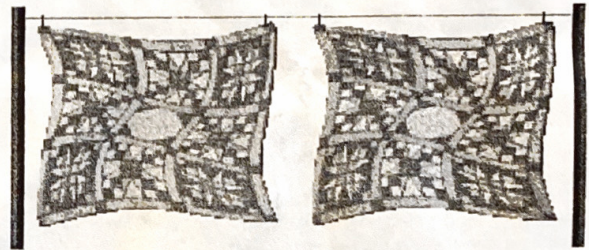
