

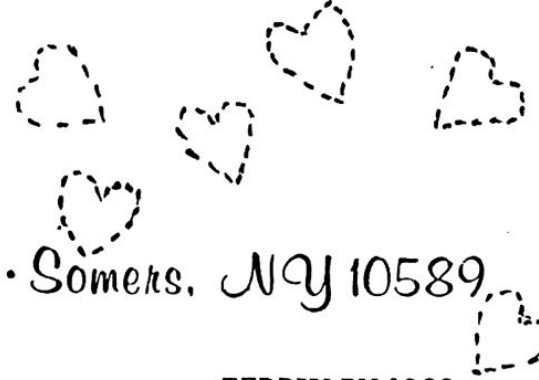

FIRST CLASS

SAVE-ALL

Made up of many little nine-patches and several others of odd shapes, this block measures about 23" across. Since so many color combinations or arrangements are possible and so many odds and ends of scraps may be used, the number of pieces for each pattern is not given. Count the pieces in the illustration for your combination.

White makes a nice balance for the colors and prints. The white pieces (D) just outside the dark center should be the size of 2 B's and a C put together.

A quilt 78x100, using a 6" border will require about 1 yd for the strip areas, 1 yd for the dark areas, 2/3 yd for the dotted areas, 6 yds white, 1 1/2 yds of a color for border. Border may be in 2 strips.

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
