Announcements were madefor the many excellent workshops surrounding our quilt show.






The date of the Quilt Judging meeting is to be Feb. 12th.

Upcoming workshop schedules were announced.


A basting clinic was held at 7PM before the meeting. One person brought her quilt and supplies and helping hands had it completely basted before the meeting started.





Homage to Amanda and Quilt Digest 3 are on order but have not yet arrived.

Irma Shore made announcements on the Antique Quilt Preservation Committee. There will be a meeting on Sept. 26th at 10am at the Southeast Museum in Brewster. The guild will also be working on a quilted weathermap for The Great American Quilt Festival. The first meeting will be on Oct. 2nd at Pam Gibson's house. This quilt must be completed by the end of February.

Quilt Show Co-chairmen, Rita Floess and Pat Dawe introduced the Quilt Show Committee Members as listed in the newsletter. Carol Sterk announced a fashion show of aprons for the next meeting. Suzanna Valentinetti is in charge of aprons and workshops are being offered on their design and construction.

Kathy Sica reported on the Quilt Raffle. This year's quilt is an all applique album quilt. There is a sign-up sheet for the quilt blocks. Some of the block kits are ready now. The remainder will be mailed out during the coming week. Only one raffle grant application has been received to date. The deadline is Sept. 30, 1985.

A letter of thanks was read from the Hospice of Northern Westchester for receiving last year's grant of more than \$6300.

Program Chairman, Elva Fisher began the program with Show and Tell. Fourteen members participated. This was followed by a wonderful slide presentation and entertaining talk by our guest, Judy Mathieson.
