Hospitality: Barbara Yerks announced the Salad supper in June, bring main dish salad, doors open at 5:30, supper at 6:00.


Membership: Barbara Broshous reported for Bernice Strauber. 147 members and 1 guest.


Old business: Official vote on slate - carried unanimously. New board members will take office at July joint meeting.

Slate was presented to the membership, motion to accept by Adrienne Yorinks, motion was carried by majority, none opposed.





Old business: reminder of announcement in newsletter for anyone interested in meeting about Tree Festival Super Saturday.


New business: Joyce announced she would have basic skill workshops at her home for anyone interested.

First Place: Beyond Beginning: Abandoned Patchwork,



MEMBERSHIP: Bernice Strauber gave a count of members and guest present: 145 members, 7 guests.



QUILT SHOW: Quilt being worked on, show notices are ready.


OLD BUSINESS: Our Tree Festival tree brought in \$500. Challenge due in February. February meeting is one week early.




