President Mirman opened the meeting by referring to a letter received by many members from Hartsdale Fabrics. The decision not to invite them to have a booth at our 1994 show was not a political decision, but one made by the Quilt Show committee and was done only after serious consideration of their failure to abide by the conditions of the contract they had signed. This failure had been an ongoing problem and had continued despite warnings. She thanked them for their previous generosity in providing a raffle machine but also pointed out they had been the recipient of business as a result of their participation. She again reminded the membership that the membership list is not to be used for any commercial purposes.

QUILT SHOW - Barbara Lerch thanked the Trumbul show for including our raffle quilt - we sold \$345 worth of tickets. Volunteers are still needed for Sunday night takedown and Friday night food. Raffle prizes will be given throughout the two show days as a result of donations. 191 pieces have been received for the show including 66 full size quilts. Nancy Mirman announced the slate for next year.

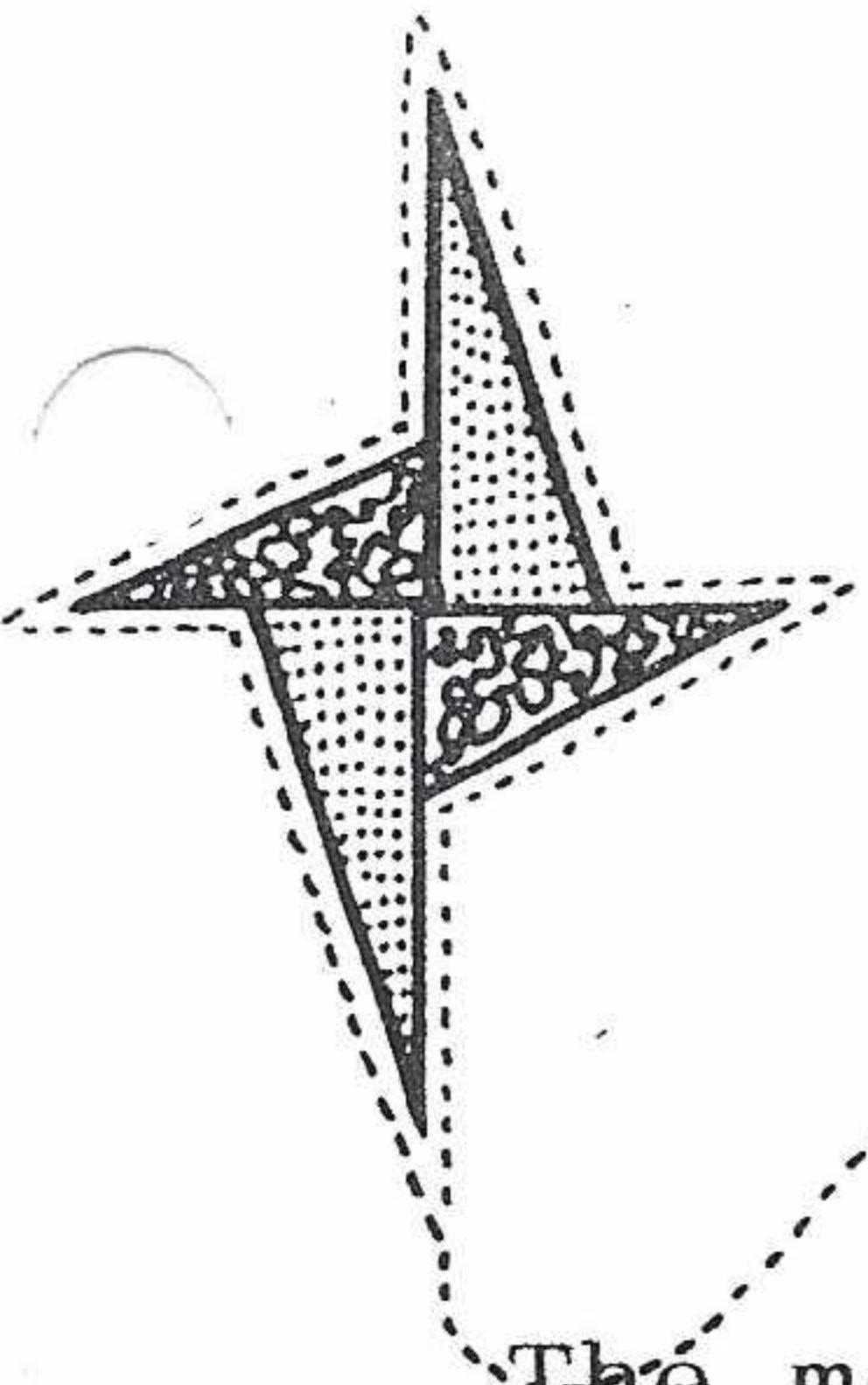
