

The Ronald McDonald House needs help decorating their new facilities at Maria Ferari Hospital.


# Please donate 2 blocks (9 1/2" edge to edge) and Comfort Quilts will use them to create new twin-sized bed quilts.

### One Woman Show -Mary Anne Ciccotelli

Mary Anne Ciccotelli is not sure how long she has been quilting because she cannot remember a time when quilting was not a part of her life. During her lecture "The Legacy Lives On - Five Generations of Quilters" she shares a little about the lives of the quilters who came before her and explains how she is passing on the love of quilting to her daughters and granddaughters. She also shares the five generations of quilts that she has in her home. Her story was featured in The Quilting Quarterly, Fall 2006 (published by NQA) in an article written by Sylvia Landman Rasmussen.

After the attacks on the World Trade Center in 2001, Mary Anne felt compelled to reach out to those families affected in her community. Being a quilter, she decided to make a quilt for each of the 10 families that had lost someone in the tragedy. She posted a request on the internet asking for quilters to send her blocks to be used in the project. The response was overwhelming! From the help of many wonderful quilters all across the world, over 30 quilts were made and distributed to local families in the Westchester, New York area including the ten families in Pelham. Her work was featured on the local television station and in several local newspapers.

She is excited about opportunities to share her lifelong sewing and quilting talents and experiences with others. She presents lectures and workshops in the tri-state area to quilt guilds and other interested parties and continues experimenting with high-tech methods to enhance these presentations. She has designed several styles of Hexabags<sup>TM</sup> and offers patterns for these unique bags. She is also developing a class that will be offered on the Internet through Quilt University later this year or early 2008.

Mary Anne is striving to keep the love of sewing (and quilting) alive and well by teaching children's sewing classes on a weekly basis in her studio. Additionally, she teaches hand-sewing to young children during their lunch-time enrichment hour program in the local grade schools. 
Dessert, cold drinks, coffee and tea will be provided.


