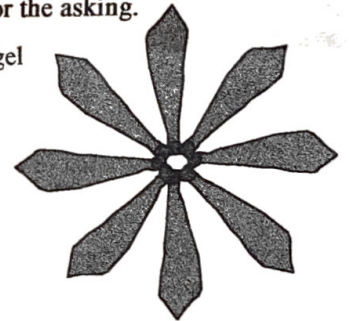

# The Really Big Show... World of Quilts XXI

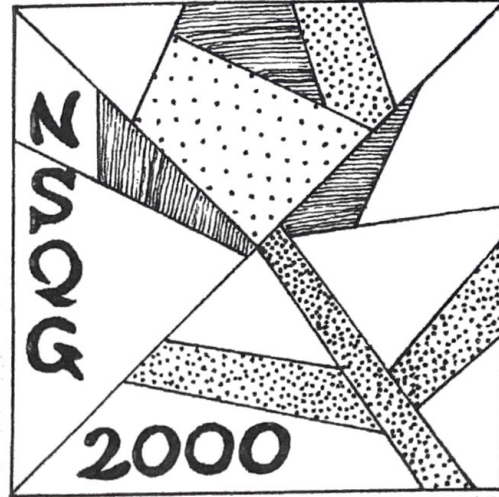
**May 6 & 7,

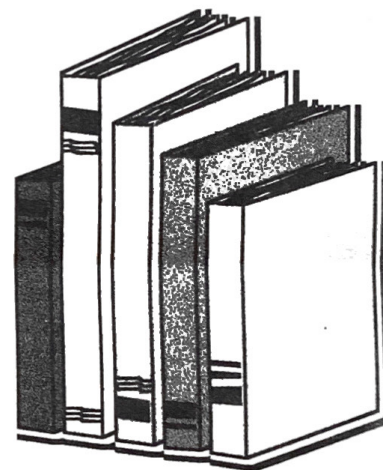

## On the Road Again

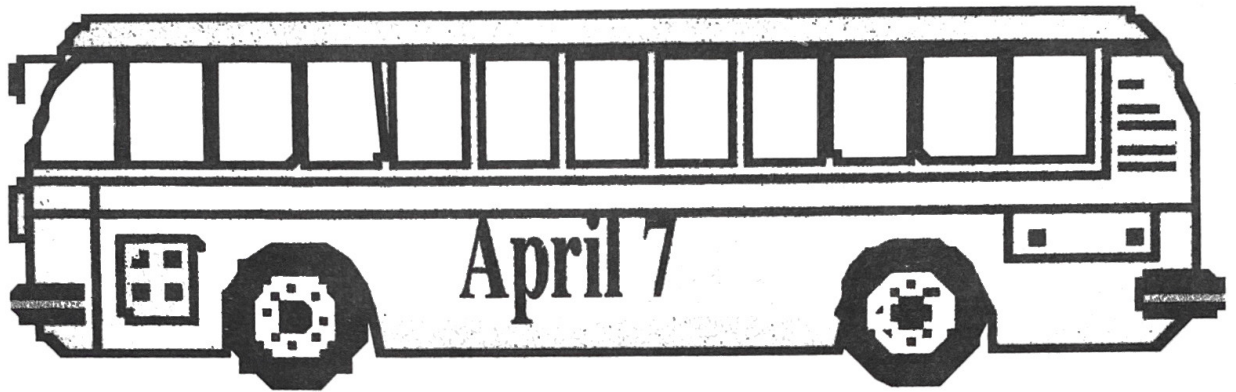
### Rollin' Rollin' Rollin'...Keep those Quilters Rollin'

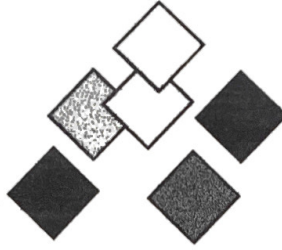
# Fabric Exchange
