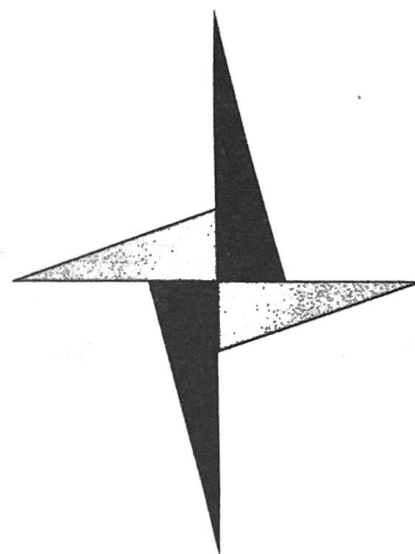
Thank you Sondra Shapiro for the photo journey back in time to "World of Quilts 2001"! It was a wonderful reminder of how great our Quilt Show

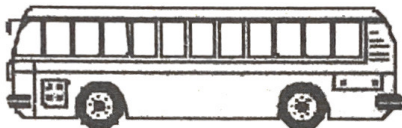
Jackie will explore the nature of the person within this genius and we will look at the designs he created and how they can be applied to quilting.

Round Robin Quilts March

SPECIAL NOTICE: When you bring your piece in to the March meeting (having added the 2 1/2-in. February border) please exchange with the following people—NOT the ones shown on the original rotation list.

Within each group, #3 passes to #5

#4 passes to #6

#5 passes to #1

#6 passes to #2

#1 passes to #3

#2 passes to #4.

This should ensure that everyone has worked on almost each quilt top one time, which was the main intention.

This month you will complete the quilt top with the final border. Pull everything together with a finished look by adding 5 inches all around. Do whatever makes you happy. Bring the completed top to the April meeting and pass it back to the original center block maker. The name should be on the back of the center block. Everyone will display the results at Show & Tell.

Take your piece home to quilt and bind before turning it in to Comfort Quilts. If you absolutely cannot quilt it (this is an excellent opportunity to practice machine quilting) you can give the top to me or to Pat Baker and we will have someone finish it.

I hope this has been a fun project for those who participated. I know I have enjoyed it. There were a couple of rotation mistakes on my part but I think I have finally gotten it right. Let me know if there is continued interest for next year and I will organize it again. If you have some ideas, pro or con, share them with me. There are a few fresh ideas that I have in mind to keep it interesting and challenging.

Education — March 2002

Here's the entire list of all the classes for the rest of the year. We still have some openings in Jackie Robinson's 3-D Sampler class on Tuesday March 19. Give me a call if you want to sign up. There are many openings in both of the Mary Stori classes in April and a few openings in everything else.

Jackie Robinson

Three Dimensional Patchwork Sampler—You will learn fold-and-sew techniques for bow ties, on-point center squares, flying geese, Ohio stars, pinwheels, and more. Blocks will be chosen for their techniques to make up a 3-D Sampler quilt. Tuesday, March 19 - \$40

Trio of Tesses—Three tessellated quilt designs will be taught—Tessellating Leaves, Tessellating Reels, and Tessellating Trout. If you love working with colors, you will greatly enjoy this workshop. Wednesday, March 20 - \$40

Mary Stori

Quilts That Stand Out in a Crowd—Accentuate your quilting motifs with trapunto. Learn to adapt templates and designs for stuffing, cording, and padding without damage to the quilt back. This is a handwork class but techniques easily translate to the machine. Tuesday, April 16 - \$40

Mix or Match—You will make your own "custom Yardage" out of solid fabric by stitching lines, motifs, shapes etc. inspired by a print fabric you bring to class. The "yardage" will be used to make a vest or jacket, while the print fabric can be used for binding, piping, cuffs, etc. Easy, immediate gratification workshop! Wednesday, April 17 - \$40

Marsha McCloskey

Both classes will be held at JFK at 1:30 in the afternoon. They are non-sewing classes.

Pieced Borders—This is a 3-hour workshop being offered during the quilt show. Learn to solve the mysteries of designing and sewing pieced borders that fit your quilt top perfectly! Saturday, May 4 - \$25 for guild members, \$30 for non-guild members.

The Nature of Yellow—This is a 3-hour workshop being offered during the quilt show. Yellow is the strongest color of all the colors, one avoided by many quilt makers. This is an exploratory color class seeking understanding of the place of

yellow in quilts. Sunday, May 5 - \$25 for guild members \$30 for non-guild members

Quilting Caveman Style—This primitive improvisational method sets aside measuring, straight edges, and quarter inch seams. Students will learn to piece free-form curves, unique frames and borders. Monday May 6 - \$40 for guild members, \$50 for non-guild members.

Bethany Reynolds

Magical Cubes & Secret Stairways—Stack and Whack with a twist—optical illusions! See the cover of her new book and that's what we will make! Tuesday May 21 - \$40

All classes are \$40 OR \$75 if you take both classes by the same instructor unless otherwise noted. Please write a check made out to NSQG for each instructor, dated the first of the month of the month of the workshop. 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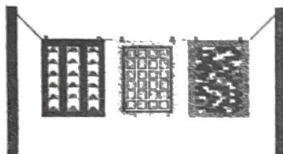
We are temporarily out of quilt kits, but they are in process and may possibly be ready by meeting time. Ask Pat if you are interested.

Our numbers are growing, but we have room for many more— all are welcome.

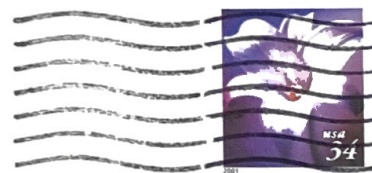
