QUILTING FOR THE HOLIDAYS.....

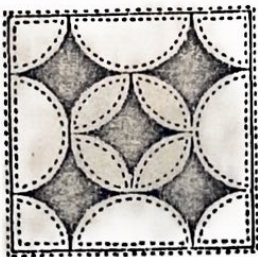
