OUR GUEST LECTURER FOR NOVEMBER 17TH WILL BE JANET ELWIN OF AMESBURY, MASS. SHE IS THE AUTHOR OF THE BOOK HEXAGON MAGIC AND WILL BE LECTURING ON HEXAGONS AND THEIR USES AND ADAPTATIONS ON TUESDAY EVENING AS WELL AS GIVING A WORKSHOP ON HER PAPER-FREE TECHNIQUE FOR BOTH HAND AND MACHINE PIECING ON WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 18. JANET TRANSPORTS HEXAGONS FROM THE TRADITIONAL BABY BLOCKS AND FLOWER GARDENS TO NEW AND EXCITING DIMENSIONS. A REAL TREAT.

THE LAP QUILTS FOR SHUT-INS IS AN ON-GOING PROJECT AND THEY WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR WORKING ON PRIOR TO THE BUSINESS MEETING. SEVERAL MEMBERS HAVE TAKEN TOPS HOME TO WORK ON BETWEEN MEETINGS AND FOR THIS WE ARE VERY THANKFUL. HOWEVER, UNLESS MORE OF US ARE WILLING TO GIVE A FEW MINUTES OF OUR TIME ON A REGULAR BASIS THIS PROJECT WILL TAKE FOREVER. PLEASE HELP.

THIS MONTH WE WILL BE HAVING A BLOCK RAFFLE INSTEAD OF A FABRIC RAFFLE. THE PATTERN IS A SIMPLE CHRISTMAS TREE. THOSE WHO WISH TO PARTICIPATE MAY BRING ONE OR MORE BLOCKS. FOR EACH BLOCK YOU BRING YOU WILL BE GIVEN ONE RAFFLE TICKET. THE LUCKY WINNERS CAN USE THEIR BLOCKS FOR QUILTS, WALL HANGINGS, TREE SKIRTS, TABLE RUNNERS, GARMENTS, ETC. HOPEFULLY SOME WILL COME BACK FOR SHOW AND TELL NEXT MONTH.

THERE HAVE BEEN SEVERAL SUGGESTIONS THAT THE BOOK REPORT TAKE WRITTEN FORM SO THAT YOU CAN REFER BACK TO IT FOR PURCHASE INFORMATION. THIS MONTH WE WILL GIVE IT A TRY. LET US KNOW YOUR REACTION. IN LINE WITH THE THEME FOR OUR BLOCK CONTEST, HOUSING PROJECTS BY NANCY MARTIN PUBLISHED BY THAT PATCHWORK PLACE<sup>tm</sup> HAS BEEN SELECTED FOR NOVEMBERS REVIEW.

WHILE GIVING PATTERNS FOR NEARLY A DOZEN PIECED AND APPLIQUED HOUSES, THIS \$9.95 BOOK ALSO PRESENTS MANY USES FOR THE BLOCKS. IT DOES NOT STOP AT SUGGESTIONS BUT FOLLOWS THROUGH GIVING PATTERNS AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR FINISHED PROJECTS. THERE ARE SECTIONS ON SEVERAL TECHNIQUES SUCH AS APPLIQUE, STRIP PIECING, AND MITERING THAT CAN BE USED BEYOND THE HOUSING PROJECTS. IT IS LIMITED IN THE RANGE OF HOUSE PATTERNS PRESENTED, BUT THOSE GIVEN ARE COVERED SO WELL THAT DEPARTURE TO A PATTERN OF ONE'S OWN CREATION USING THE INCLUDED TECHNIQUES WOULD BE A NATURAL PROGRESSION.

STARTING IN DECEMBER WE WILL HAVE FOUR MONTHS OF PRE-MEETING INSTRUCTION SESSIONS. WE WILL CONCENTRATE ON THOSE TECHNIQUES WHICH WILL BRING ALL OF OUR MEMBERS TO QUILTING PROFICIENCY FOR NEXT YEARS MEMBERSHIP. EACH MONTH WE WILL DO A DIFFERENT BLOCK AND THEY WILL BE ASSEMBLED INTO A WALL HANGING WITH COMPLETION DIRECTIONS. THE DECEMBER NEWSLETTER WILL GIVE SPECIFIC INSTRUCTION AS TO WHAT TO BRING TO THE MEETING FOR THESE SESSIONS.



 sewing line


cut on lengthwise fold - grain

centers


unit 1

Join the pieces of Unit 1. Be careful of the long bias edges - pin thoroughly and avoid stretching. Join the pieces of Unit 2. Join Unit 2 to Unit one matching centers of B & D. Should measure 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" after careful pressing.
