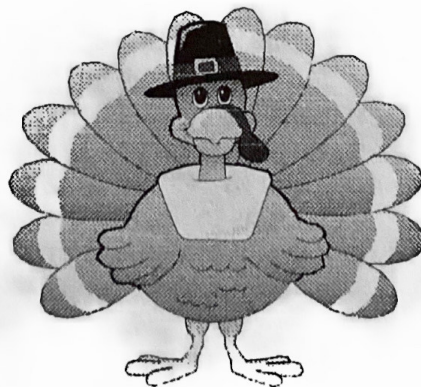
Studio Work:

*The How, Where, When
and Why of What I Do*

November 18, 1997

The long awaited and greatly anticipated visit of Michael James will take place in November, when he will deliver his lecture, "Studio Work: The How, Where, When and Why Of What I Do".

This celebrated quilt artist holds both Bachelor and Master of Fine Arts degrees and is among a small group of studio artists who have turned to quilting as an expressive artistic medium. His non-traditional approach to quilting has been influenced equally by his training as a painter and by his study of history and development of American quilting and its techniques. His "Quiltmaker Handbook" series of books are considered classic



guidelines for the Quilter interested in the creative approach to contemporary design.

Michael James's work has been exhibited widely throughout the United States, Europe and Japan. His work has been included in four Quilt National competitions, and his commissioned wall quilts are in numerous private and corporate collections. In 1993, Michael James was inducted into the Quilter's Hall of Fame.

Don't miss out on this lecture as our guest speaker fulfills his promise to "lay bare the secrets" of his creative activities and suggest how he managed to integrate his art and his life.

NSQG's 1997 Raffle Quilt — The Recipient!

Decisions, decisions, it's time for us to make a decision. Three very worthwhile charities have been nominated to receive the monies from the sale of the raffle tickets. We'll be voting for one of the following charities at our next meeting — so read carefully! The nominees are:

Hospice of Orange in Hudson Valley, Inc.

This is a community-based program of home care which treats the terminally ill patient and family as a unit. Hospice provides supportive care to meet the special needs arising out of those physical, psychological, spiritual, social and economic stresses which are experienced during the final stages of illness, and during dying and bereavement. Hospice services are coordinated through an interdisciplinary team which includes nurses, social workers, physicians, clergy, volunteers and related therapists.

Mount Kisco Day Care Center

The MKDCC is committed to serving an ethnically, culturally and economically diverse population. Forty-seven percent of MKDCC families receive financial assistance from the scholarship fund to attend the center. The MKDCC recently received a gift of the former headquarters of Dansk Intl. Corp. to expand its services to the children of Northern Westchester. To convert the property, a capital fund drive to raise \$1.3 million has been

launched. The ability of the Center to expand its services to needy families of working parents in the Northern Westchester/Putnam area depends on the successful outcome of its fund raising drive.

Literacy Volunteers of Putnam

With the efforts of 95 dedicated tutors, the LVA of Putnam County serves over 125 adults with individual and group tutoring of both basic reading and English as a Second Language. The organization also provides programs in Family Literacy, training for the US citizenship test, an advanced reading/writing workshop for ESL students, and outreach to substance abuse facilities and prisons. As the sponsor wrote in her letter to me, "Could you be who you are today if you couldn't read or write any better than a first grader?"

Opus

This stands for Organization for People Undaunted by Stroke...and other physical disabilities. Opus was founded in 1979 as a place where people with disabilities, who would otherwise be homebound and isolated, can restore their self worth through shared experiences, recreation and community projects. Members meet

three days per week in Hartsdale and participate in volunteer work, discussions, activities, entertainment, and celebrations as well as physical therapy and speech therapy sessions. Their members range from the mid-20's to the mid-90's. They are hoping to expand to be able to better serve the increasing numbers of people looking to join this warm, safe and friendly environment.

Each of these organizations would be a very worthy recipient of the proceeds generated by our gorgeous raffle quilt. The choice is yours! Please read over these nominations carefully. A ballot will be handed out at the November meeting and we will be voting for one of them to be the recipient of our quilt raffle sales.

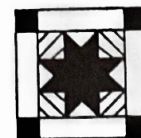

Announcing... The NSQG 1997/1998 Challenge!

Our theme this year will be: *The Four Elements: Earth, Air, Fire and Water*

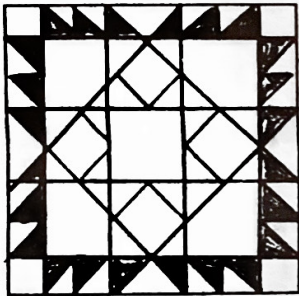
The Rules are:

- You must chose 1, 2, 3 or 4 of the "elements" for your quilt's theme.
- You must choose one of the two blocks for each element. For each element chosen, you must use at least one of the appropriately themed blocks. Interpret the block in any way you choose — either traditionally or creatively.
- The perimeter must not exceed 144" and there is no minimum (so all you mini-quilters can join the fun!)
- There is no fabric requirement — *except* — please use colors and images appropriate for your theme.

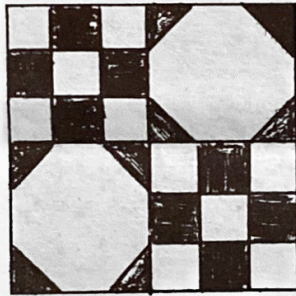
The usual Challenge Policies are also in effect:

- Keep your challenge project a secret.
- Your project must be a finished quilt (three layers quilted together by hand or machine)
- We must be able to hang your quilts on a wall.
- The deadline will be one week before the February meeting. Drop off points will be announced in January.
- All entries will hang together in a Challenge display at the World of Quilts Show in May 1988. You may enter your challenge quilt to be judged in the 1999 show, but not in the 1998 judging.
