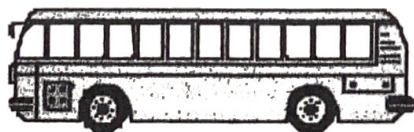

This year's quilt show will feature a special display/silent auction of the quilts which complete that phrase. The quilt's subject can reflect a wide range of topics including both inanimate and animate objects, and intangibles. They

should be a maximum 96 inches in circumference which is approximately 24" square quilts and they will be auctioned off, half on Saturday and the other half on Sunday.



Our auction will benefit the Danbury Women's Center, that helps 20,000 people every year in various capacities. Isn't it wonderful that we have such a wonderful center in the Housatonic Valley that is actively helping women in crisis? So far quite a few members have registered many interesting and

diverse subject matter. (Light, wine, goldfish, birdhouses, baskets, etc.) But we need MORE—a huge outpouring of quilts to give bidders a large selection. Any quilts not meeting the minimum bid will be donated to the Center and these will go to families starting off in a safe home.

And if you can't think of a special "thing" you'd love to have in your home? Visit your local quilt store or look through a catalogue. All the popular subjects are represented.



I encourage everyone to participate. These small pieces don't have to be great masterpieces, and aren't being voted on or even judged. Each just needs to be a nice quilt that someone will be proud to display in their home. If you don't want to make a quilt, you can make a tote bag, school book bag, or other item that you think would be a popular seller.

Register your topic now before your favorite "thing" gets taken. (Incidentally, only one person so far has reserved cats.) We don't want to have duplicate subjects on the same day, so there can only be two quilts per subject—one to be auctioned off per day.

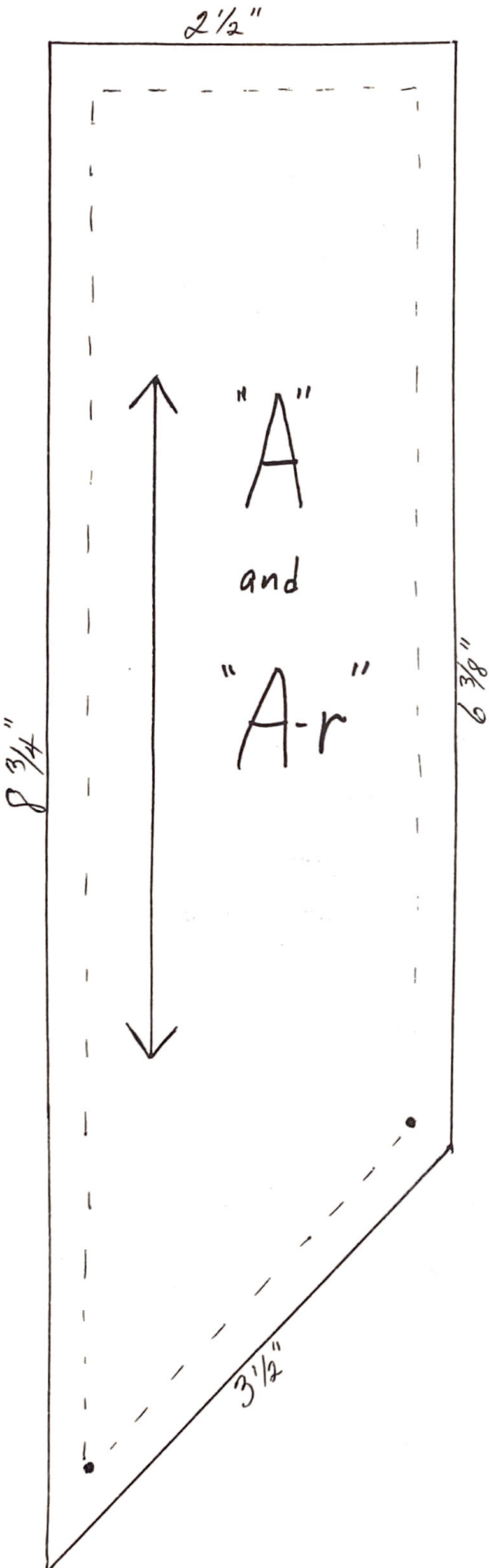

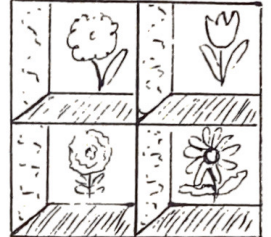
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CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Cut 6 1/2" squares from interesting "child" fabric for each of 4 blocks. (May be same fabric, or different.)

Cut 4 "A" from a light fabric.
 Cut 4 "A-r" from dark fabric.
 Mark dots on wrong side of all pieces.



SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

Stitch shorter length of "A" to left side of a square ending at dot. Backstitch a couple stitches.
 Stitch shorter length of "A-r" to bottom of square ending at dot. Backstitch.
 Pin through dots to attach "A" to "A-r". Stitch, 1/4" seam, backstitching at inner dot. Press seams.

Repeat for remaining 3 blocks then join 4 blocks together to form 16" square block. Press.

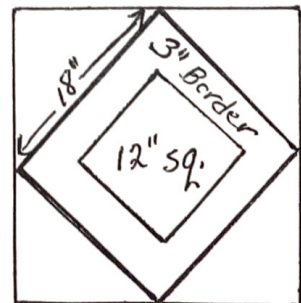
ROUND-ROBIN QUILTERS

This month the block will be turned on point and corners with applique will be added.

Cut two 14" squares of background fabric. Split each square diagonally, corner to corner, into 2 triangles. Result - 4 triangles 14"x 14" x 20". Some excess is provided for ease in handling. The 20" side will attach to block.

Applique on these triangles, any design you wish, by hand or machine. If you use Wonder-under you must also machine finish the edges.

Center completed triangles on each side of the 18" block. Stitch in place. Press. Square up and trim leaving 1/4" seam allowance all around new square. Return for exchange at Nov. meeting.

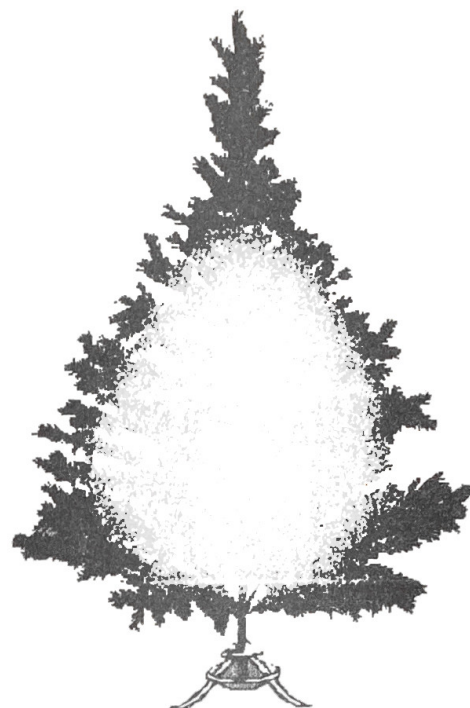


Ornament Saturday

1. Pat Baker will be teaching a full-day class. Together, she and her students will hand applique decorative shapes onto a delightful and festive tree skirt.
2. Carrie Vollrath will be teaching two half-day sessions. Her ornament is an adorable felt teddy bear sure to bring back happy memories of your childhood.
3. Linda Von Ahn will be doing one half-day class. The ornament is a beautiful, round, Scandinavian, felt, embroidered, red/white/green, four-inch ball. The class should be a lot of fun. She will be there all day.
4. Joyce Sullivan will be doing two half-day sessions. The first, a snowman stocking, and cute little Santa Face ornaments.
5. Linda Ostrander will be doing two half-day classes. Her chosen ornament is a colorful and lovely folded piece that can be made using one of four different designs.
6. Marie Rohman will also be doing two half-day sessions. She is offering her students the choice of making an angel ornament, complete with wings and a halo or a pretty and simple nine-patch ornament. Ambitious students may be able to make a few of each.

Completed blocks must be returned by the January 16, 2001 NSQG meeting. This will be a fun project for all of us!





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Education

Tuesday, Oct 17 "Layered Landscapes." Bring a landscape photo and turn it into an applique design. Layer the landscape so no muslin is needed.

2. For EACH class you wish to take I must receive a check for \$30 dated the month of the class. (I hold all checks until the class in case there is a cancellation.)

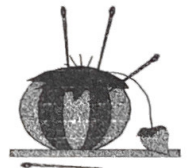

Better than a workshop, working at her own pace and on a pattern of her choice, help is at hand when problems arise.
