MEMBER SHOWCASE: PAT WAILL

My interest in sewing and needlework dates back to my childhood when I learned to use my mother's old Singer, converted from a treadle machine. Over the years I explored a number of the needle arts – embroidery, knitting, traditional rug hooking. I also enjoyed taking some art classes which opened up a new world of color and design. However, it wasn't until the 1980's, when I stopped working and my children were

grown, that I decided to take a quilting class with Terry Reilly at the White Plains YWCA. Everything came together and like so many others, I was hooked. As a bonus, and perhaps the best part, I was introduced to a wonderful circle of friends who shared my passion.

I have never been a collector of the usual kinds of things, but fabric is the exception. As my husband and I have traveled, the high point of a trip became finding a store where I could acquire something new to add to my stash. Since I usually buy before I know how I will use it, much of my work falls into the scrap category.

My early efforts were largely done by hand, and to this day I love the tranquility of hand piecing and quilting and needle-turn appliqué. While most of my pieces might be considered traditional, I almost always use a design wall to help place color, value and texture. Every phase of a project has its pleasures, and I think myself fortunate to be involved in such rewarding work.

In October, Mary Cannizzaro will be doing a demonstration on the use of Rick Rack in your quilts. If you were at the September meeting, our guest speaker brought with her a gorgeous quilt using this method. Here is a description of the upcoming demonstration in Mary's own words:

I have always loved Rick Rack. When my daughters were small, I made most of their clothing and Rick Rack was a favorite trim. I took a class with Karen Stone and used it extensively as the accent for the spirals on my quilt. At the same time, I was making a Piece o' Cake appliqué quilt and outlined each flower and leaf with Rick Rack. If you come to my demonstration at the **Not for Beginners Only** group, I'll give you some tips and tricks on the best way to handle it. I'll also bring examples of different uses for Rick Rack and quilts that feature Rick Rack. Stop by and share.

Design, Surface and Stitch and Creative Quilts:


