## QUILT BLOCK OF THE MONTH - Calico Dahlia

Eight different calico prints are used to make this flower to be appliqued on a 14-inch square of solid fabric (white or pastel). Crease and find center of square and place 8 petals around, lapping from small notch to center. The solid yellow center circles are appliqued after the petals. Make stem from 3/4 inch bias in green. For a quilt 78 x 92 inches, a 4 inch border and 30 blocks are needed. Approximate yardage - 6 yds. white or pastel, 1/4 yd. green, 1/6 yd. yellow, 1 yd. for border and 15 inches of each of 8 calico prints. (Look for patterns elsewhere in NEWS 'n NOTES.)

## COFFEE and. . . . at meetings.....



Printing frequently distorts patterns. Even a marginal error of 1/8 of an inch will throw a pattern off. It is a good idea to cut the pattern pieces out and fit together to make sure of an accurate fit before cutting into material. Saves time and \$\$\$\$\$.




