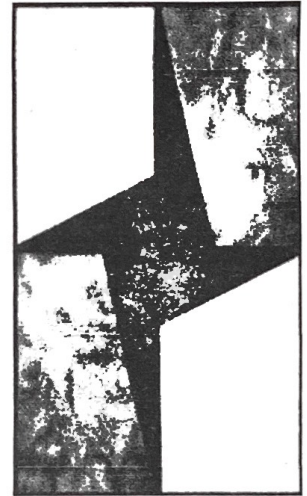

## Raffle Quilt Charity Nominations

If you were at the June meeting, you heard from the representative of Friends of Karen how appreciative they were of the funds raised by our quilt raffle. Well, it's time again to nominate the recipient for next year. Please read the guidelines below to see if a favorite charity of yours would qualify. The charity would be able to answer any questions about qualification. Submit the name and description (in writing) to one of us, listed below by **October 15, 2002** and we will include it on our ballot in November.

### Guidelines

1. The organization must be a nonprofit organization
  - A. It can be partially funded.
  - B. The applicant must have sole control of their budget.
  - C. A NSQG donation should not affect any other funding.
2. Only organizations serving people in the tri-state area are eligible.
3. A guild member must sponsor the organization.
  - A. The applicant must submit a letter of description of services and the purpose of the organization.
  - B. The letter must be received by October 15, 2002.
4. The organization cannot receive a NSQG donation in two consecutive years.
5. The organization must sell tickets — 50 or more books — prior to the show.
6. One or more representatives from the organization must be present at the quilt show (Saturday and Sunday) all day to sell tickets at the raffle table.
7. One or more representatives of the organization must be present at the June meeting to receive the donation.

# Northern Star Quilters' Guild BLOCK CONTEST

You are invited to explore the beauties and mysteries of Africa in the Northern Star Quilters' Guild 2003 Block Contest. Using at least one batik fabric and at least one fabric with brown in it, make a block interpreting our theme of "Out of Africa." We hope you will come to our show, A World of Quilts XXIV, on Saturday, May 3, 2003 and Sunday, May 4, 2003 to see the blocks displayed. In addition to our Block Contest, there will be over 200 quilts, special exhibits, and terrific speakers.

**THEME:** "Out of Africa"

**SIZE:** A 12" square block that measures an accurate 12-1/2" square, including seam allowances. Do not bind or finish edges.

**FABRIC:** You must use at least one batik fabric. All fabrics must be pre-washed and be washable. You may use washable embellishments.

**METHOD:** You may piece and/or appliqué by hand and/or machine. Do not back (unless you need a foundation, as with crazy quilting) or quilt the block.

**COLOR:** You must use at least one fabric that has a shade of brown in it.

**DEADLINE:** March 1, 2003. Entries must be received no later than March 1st. No exceptions!

**PRIZES:** All entrants will receive one of our beautiful show pins. All finalists will receive fabric packets. The finalist blocks will be assembled into a quilt top that will be awarded in a random drawing to one of the finalists.
