Meg Cox -megcox.com

Meg's two main specialties are FAMILY TRADITIONS and QUILTING, two wildly misunderstood topics. Both are thought to be old-fashioned and un-hip which could not be farther from the truth. Today's smart parents are avid inventors of personalized rituals and

celebrations that give their kids a sense of identity, security, meaning, and fun. These traditions encompass everything from meals and activities handed down through generations to brand new rituals, including some built around cutting-edge tech devices like iPads and smart phones. The same is true of quilting: the 21 million American quilters who have built this burgeoning craft into a \$3.6 billion industry are educated, computer-literate and fiercely creative. Did you know the dominant version of quilt-design software is in version 7?

Meg's experience with quilting partly extends over the 25 years that she has been a passionate quilter. Additionally, Meg served on the board of the national nonprofit **Quilt Alliance** for 10 years and was president for six years. She writes a popular free monthly e-newsletter called **Quilt Journalist Tells All**. See her commentary on modern quilting in the hit 2011 documentary, **Stitch**.

earned her BFA from Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, NY. Following careers in the New York City fashion and film industries, she embarked on her solo journey as a studio artist. Sharing her expertise by teaching and lecturing on mixed media art techniques, the creative process and inspiration is Natalya's way of making sure art and craft is accessible to everyone.

#### Karen Griska - Quilts from the Selvage Edge

Twenty years ago selvages were plain. Just the company name and little round color windows. That was about it. Now that quilters are using these formerly discarded strips to make quilts, manufacturers are using beautiful fonts, more words and winsome little images for the color windows.

### **Challenge Quilts**

This year's challenge theme – 'Card Tricks' – each a magical work of art!

#### 100 Amulet Challenge Connected by Threads

We give high praise and great thanks to Susan Ball Faeder for her book 100 Amulets and for her permission to complete our own amulet challenge. Susan was a long time NSQG Show vendor (Quilters Express to Japan), a tour guide to Japan for some of us, and a good friend to many of us, and an inspiration to all of us. Connected By Threads has made 10 amulets each to exchange with each other following this exhibit. Thus, our own "100 Amulets" to display. While Susan had a strict policy to make one amulet a day for 100 days, we had no time frame or theme to meet, only a minimum and maximum size.

Enjoy the collection... we loved making them!

### **Comfort Quilts**

Comfort Quilts is an NSQG charitable project where members come together and create quilts for charities. Through various agencies, the Comfort Quilters provided over 500 quilts this past year to children, young adults, families, and individuals who have suffered illness, trauma, or other dire circumstances and are in need of comfort.

# Special Interest Groups

Special Interest Groups, SIGs, are formed by members interested in pursuing a unique method, topic, or design in their quilting. Typically, groups meet either before the regular guild meetings or at a mutually convenient time; many SIGs continue to meet virtually.

# Improv Special Interest Group Inspired by Anni Albers and Upcycled Fragments of Summer

The twelve members of the Improv SIG meet virtually and in person to explore improv techniques and challenges and support each other's journey into the art of improv quilting.

Improvisational quilters take inspiration from many sources: nature, architecture, and other artists. In this case, the Bauhaus weaver Anni Albers prompted a conversation as well as a challenge. Her linear, minimalistic work both on paper and in cloth, influenced our work in the **Inspired by Anni Albers** display.

**Upcycled** was inspired by fiber artists like Natalya Khorover, Karen Griska and Sherri Lynn Wood. Members of the Improv SIG challenged each other to create pieces made from recycled materials. Many of the pieces are embellished with embroidery inspired by Boro, a Japanese mending tradition, and the "slow stitching" movement.

Improv SIG 2 members study the work of well-known improvisational quilters and then challenge ourselves to create something using those techniques. We also discuss principles of art and design. Fragments of Summer combines improv piecing with a color and value proportion study, inspired by the abstract expressionist Pearl Fine's painting, Summer. Each Improv SIG 2 member was assigned a segment of the painting and provided with a "kit" of Jennifer Sampou's Sky Ombre fabric. We each created a quilt block using the colors and values in similar proportions to those found in the section of the painting.

### **Scrappy Special Interest Group**

This year's Scrappy SIG exhibit focuses on two distinct projects that our members worked on over the year. The first is "making something beautiful out of something ugly". Each member was given a bag of completely mismatched scraps and asked to make a block. Everyone was given one fabric that HAD to be incorporated, which allowed for some continuity between the blocks, which were then made into a quilt.

Our second project is what we call "Schniggles"; minute morsels trimmed off when squaring blocks, wads of thread, bits of yarn and ribbon - the detritus of the sewing room. We learned a technique for sewing them together to make unique designs, which can be used in many different ways.

# Inspired by Art Special Interest Group A Bouquet of Ideas

The Inspired by Art Special Interest Group studies art of all genres. We discussed different styles and ways to work with fabrics: fabric collage, 3-d, embroidery etc. We had our own members teach and share different techniques, and we decided to create flowers inspired by them. The pieces on display reflect our individual interpretation of flowers based on the many styles and our member's teaching.
