

NORTHERN STAR QUILTERS GUILD MINUTES: GENERAL MEETING, SEPTEMBER 20, 2004

Susie Andersen, President, called the meeting to order at 7:30P.

Membership: Kathy Vanacoro reported that there were 181 paid members in attendance.

Susie announced programs by two museums in the area at which our participation is requested.

- There will be an exhibit of crafts at the Elephant Hotel, opening October 7, and she had been contacted to find individuals interested in submitting contemporary quilts to be included in the exhibit. Contact is Terry Ariano at the Elephant Hotel Museum. The Guild has also been asked to come and demonstrate quilting on a weekend early next year. There will also be a gift shop where quilt related items could be offered for sale.
- The American Museum of Folk Art in NYC. Pat Slavin and Fran Phillips have volunteered to take raffle quilt to exhibit and sell raffle tickets. Later it was announced that the quilt would not be going to the museum, as it would not be finished in time.

Houston Trip: Linda Jennings needs full payment of all participants by October 1. She will then secure etickets, and mail the eticket and an itinerary to each participant.

Special Events: Leslie Forrest reported on the trip to Fort Washington. There were 24 people on the trip, who spent a total of \$3062.

Membership: Kathy Vanacoro announced that Melanie Groh will do an orientation for new members each month. The membership book will be compiled after the next general meeting. Membership cards will be available at the next meeting.

Challenge Quilts: Jeri Riggs announced that Challenge quilts are due at the January meeting. The theme is "Portrait of ---" Size should be 18"x22". Challenge quilts will be displayed at the February meeting.

Programs: Suzanne Sunday said there were still spots available in the workshop to be held the following day. Also mentioned that there will be a 2-day weekend workshop in January. She asked for volunteers to

- Co-ordinate the in-house duties of Programs, involving the setup the Speaker needs at JFK

Charitable Donations: Mary Cannizaro introduced Linda Ostrander, who designed and co-ordinated the construction of the Raffle Quilt for next year's Show. Linda asked for volunteers to hand quilt the Raffle Qui;t.


Square Robin/Comfort Quilts: Pat Baker explained how the Square Robin works. All finished quilts go to Comfort Quilts. She re-iterated that Comfort Quilts meeting the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month., but that for scheduling conflict reasons the next meeting will be on September 30th.

Quilt Show: Caryl Castellion announced that the drop in attendance at last year's show and the resulting loss of revenue had caused the Show's budget deficit.

- Nina Primer announced that the deadline for nominations of the charity recipient for proceeds of the Raffle Quilt was October 5.
- The Block Contest will have a Dear Jane theme, and members were urged to submit blocks.
- Lynette Clements, Show Publicity, announced that bookmarks are available, and urged members to get some and leave them at shows they attend, or other venues.
- Marry Cannizaro announced the theme of the Silent Auction would be "Everything I always wanted to know I learned in -----"
- Carolyn Young, Boutique Chairman announced that the Holiday Boutique would be held November 13.

Treasurer: Margaret Phillips told us that the budget and all supporting documents would be available for member review at every General Meeting. The Budget was not in the first Newsletter because it was not passed in time for the deadline. Susie told the Guild that she was concerned that Guild expenses had exceeded revenue for the past two years, and that this year's Budget had a shortfall as well. She assured us that at present we are financially sound, but warned that continuing this fiscal policy would be unwise. To this end, she and the Board will be reviewing spending policies during the up-coming year.

The General Meeting was adjourned at 8:00PM.

Linda Ostrander again asked for volunteers to quilt the raffle quilt.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Leslie Forrest announced that the trip to Lancaster in April will cost \$150. Those wishing to sign up cab give their names to her or email to Susan Chapman. A \$50 deposit will be due at the January meeting.

HOLIDAY BOUTIQUE

Carolyn Young reported on the Holiday Boutique. Attendance was down because of bad weather and roads on the morning of the Boutique. Total sales were \$1470, and 20 Guild members showed their wares.

MEMBERSHIP

Kathy Vanacoro announced that membership cards and pins were available at the membership table, as well as the new membership list booklet. She reminded members that the list is not to be given to anyone outside the Guild for commercial purposes.

EDUCATION



Carolyn Langevin invited the membership to produce quilts for the Silent Auction.


Raffle ticket books will be available at the next General Meeting.

❖ Margaret Phillips – has financial information available. She will have to take \$5-6,000 out of savings to pay expenses.


❖ Degen Sayer – Members with last names starting in KLMN are to bring food for the next General Meeting.
