Kids can Quilt! -- Volunteers Needed!

Block Party at Katonah Elementary School (4-5 volunteers needed) *Tuesday, March 13* (9:15 - 11 am)

Help children learn how to hand-sew sashing to a block, print their names with fabric markers, and decorate their blocks with hand prints.

Quilt-Piecers -- Sew Quilt Top (2 volunteers needed)

Stitch the children's blocks and sashing, as well as the quilt's inner and outer borders. Directions and materials provided. Finished tops will be passed to the quilt volunteers (below).

Quilters -- Quilt and Finish the Children's Quilts (2 volunteers needed) Layer, quilt the sashing and border, and attach binding. All materials will be provided. Finished quilts are due at the NSQG May meeting.
