What an amazing Quilt Show put on by the Northern Star Quilters'
Guild! Accolades have poured in from visitors, vendors, distinguished guests and artists!

John McKie (brother-in-law of Barbara Barrick McKie) created a terrific video of our show, including many works from Barbara McKie's Nature series. Click here to see the video -- available for the whole world to see!

We had 1,600 paying visitors, six buses came from guilds near and far, and 180 Guild members volunteered

their time in this enormous effort. Four demos were well received. The Build-a-Block project saw the creation of over 200 blocks to make four quilts for the North

Salem Ambulance Corps. The Silent Auction was very successful. The Boutique satisfied the yearning of many shoppers to go home with handmade items, books and magazines, and Comfort Quilts' kits to make their own. Show pins were well received, including our pins from 2006, 2007, 2008, and 2010.

The makers of the 185 registered quilts are to be commended for their

part in filling the gym with such excitement, variety, and beauty! Without you, and the talented and dedicated Show Committee, there would be no Quilt Show! Over

400 quilts were on display in the gym and Room 114.

The variety in the Show held the visitors' attention, inspired many, many "thank you" notes, and was represented by the registered quilts, the Art SIG's "Forms of a Dress," the Guild Challenge, "Push the Limits in London: Reach for the Stars," the Comfort Quilts' educational display,

FiberArt NE's "Totems," Barbara
Barrick McKie's "Art Quilts Inspired by
Nature," and the 93 red-and-white-quilt
tribute to Joanna S. Rose and her
husband, Thinc Design and the
American Folk Art Museum.

Bonnie Hunter, of Quiltville.com, held the crowds in humor-filled attention as she described how to manage fabric excess when creating quilts -- always leading to its next use. Bonnie's many quick tips are sure to be incorporated into our next quilts.

Tom Hennes' presentation about Thinc Design's process of creating "Infinite Variety: Three Centuries of Red & White Quilts" in the Park Avenue Armory in March 2011 brought it to all who hadn't experienced the exhibit and amazed everyone who saw the process unfold. Mrs. Rose said that the presentation informed her of things she hadn't absorbed during the Armory exhibit. What a treat to have the Rose family with us!

There is much to be said, but it all comes back to a great big THANK YOU!!

Many thanks to all who submitted proposals for NSQG's 2013 Challenge! All were creative and well thought out.

Following the Board's vote, I'm pleased to announce the 2013 Challenge, which was submitted by **Nancy Mirman** and **Joyce Sullivan**. It's a color challenge -- with lots of room for creativity -- and should appeal to quilters of all stripes:

Theme: Anything you want to make! Submit your entry in the category of your choice: Traditional or Contemporary.

Colors:

- Solid black
- Solid white
- Black-and-white prints
- PLUS one color of your choice. (The color can be a solid or print but may not have other colors within the prints.)
- Embellishment and thread work are acceptable but only in black, white or the one other color of the quilt.

Size and Finishing Details:

- Minimum circumference is 48"; Maximum circumference is 80"
- Any shape is acceptable (within size requirement)
 Attach a sleeve at the top of the back, at least 2" wide.
- Label on back must include: name of quilt, name of maker, and either phone number or e-mail address.

Deadline:

Quilts will be collected at NSQG's January 2013 meeting

Awards:

- Voting will take place at our February 2013 meeting
- Each member will vote for his/her two favorite quilts in each category

- A member may not cast more than one vote for a single quilt
- 1st, 2nd, 3rd and Honorable Mention Awards will be presented in each category

Additional Notes:

- Only one entry per member
- Quilts must be 3 layers, quilted by the maker (by hand or machine)


