

Quilt Registration Deadline

Can you believe there are only two weeks left to register your quilt for the Show? It's true, March 31 is the last day to register your quilt.

There are so many exciting opportunities bringing in the new spring after a long winter. We look forward to welcoming the public to our wonderful Quilt Show thanks

Quilt Frame Setup: This very important three hour job involves setting up the frames which will be used to hang the quilts. It is done the day before the show (Friday)

Quilt Hanging: Another three hour job which involves climbing ladders and holding sometimes heavy quilts.

Quilt Takedown: The quilts all have to be returned to their owners Sunday afternoon when the show is over. A usually active task but there are some "sit-down" jobs within this category.

Quilt Frame Takedown: This task requires the taking down of the muslin and the disassembly of the frames. Husbands, sons, daughters, and others significant in your life are surely welcome.

White Glove: During the show we want a "white glove quilter" in each aisle to insure that the quilts are not touched. It is a two hour job and requires standing and walking your aisle. If you prefer two one-hour shifts, find someone to partner with so you can give each other a break.

Build A Block: A new feature this year (see newsletter for how you can assist). Volunteers will be needed to demonstrate block construction, distribute fabric and batting and then square up completed blocks. This job will certainly give you an opportunity to meet new people.

Friday Night Supper: Volunteers will be needed to assist in feeding the hungry and hard working vendors and Friday night volunteers.

12"x12" quilts were presented. They will be displayed in a combined exhibit at

show! A Mystery Demo is scheduled for the March meeting.

- Hand Appliqué In February, Jennifer Kramer demonstrated reverse appliqué leaves. In March, Denise Isherwood will demonstrate how craypas and ink can be used to give dimension and detail to the sail of a ship. This technique can also be used to add realistic looking silhouettes to a block and to add details to a fabric.
- **Dear Jane Group** The Dear Jane Group is now being coordinated by **Carolyn Finn and Rona Spar**. If you're interested in joining, please let Carolyn know. The group meets one Saturday each month at the Apple Bank in Thornwood. The next meeting is at 10 am on Saturday, March 12th.




Ronald McDonald House--Block of the Month

One of the best things about NSQG is the giving spirit of our members. Last month Comfort Quilts received 74 Roman Stripe blocks at the general meeting! Thank you so much for your support of the Ronald McDonald house! Please continue to support this worthy cause with the March block of the month!

This month the block of the month is the Friendship Star. It is made from four background squares and one square of the accent color. These pieces should be cut 3 ½ inches square so they will finish at 3 inches. The Friendship Star also has four half square triangles. (Directions follow) The colors for this block should be fall colors—golds, oranges and browns. Be SURE to angle the half squares as shown in the diagram. The block should measure 9 ½ unfinished so it will be a 9 inch finished block.



Directions for a half square triangle: Begin the square 1 inch larger than your finished square. (For this finished 3" square block, cut a 4" square.) Layer a colored square with a background square and mark the background with a diagonal line. Sew the two squares together with two seams each $\frac{1}{4}$ inch on either side of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line to yield two half square blocks. Trim to size. (For this block trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ ".)



There will be a container at the membership table to receive blocks. This is strictly a volunteer project, but we would love to have each of you join us. Questions? Call **Pat Baker** 845-279-8840.


- Best interpretation of the theme
