

## Education

#### Show and Tell

Show and Tell at the April meeting was short but good. Among other quilts, we saw a selection of the mystery quilts that were part of the project that **Carolyn Langevin** has been organizing. I hope that we'll see more of them at the May meeting (including the one that I'm working on). I'm still waiting to see all those Super Saturday projects at Show and Tell and am hoping you'll bring them in for the May meeting.

#### The Heart Quilt

You have all submitted over 125 heart blocks for our two heart quilts! Approximately 60 of us have contributed to this effort. The quilts are now being sewn together and quilted. The quilts will be donated to the American Heart Association in Westchester. The quilts will be displayed at a local hospital until October, when they will be displayed at the American Heart Association's annual walk. The American Heart Association will be holding a raffle for the quilts in conjunction with the annual walk and will use the proceeds to fund its activities in Westchester.

## **Special Interest Groups**

Art Quilt Group – Twenty-five beautiful Self Portraits were submitted for this year's challenge. Maria Weinstein, Susan Osinoff and Kendell Storm will be putting these quilts together in a display that will hang in the NSQG quilt show. Raina Knapp gave an interesting demo of Tsukineko inks and the various ways to use them on fabric and in art quilts.

Fiber Art North East, a group of art quilters that includes members of NSQG, will have its second annual show at the Mahopac Village Library. The exhibit will run during the month of June. The opening reception will be held on June 6th from 2:00-4:00 pm. The Mahopac Village Library is on Route 6 close to the center of town. We hope that all guild members will take this opportunity to see some wonderful fiber art and support the participating members.

**Hand Applique Group** - In April, the Hand Applique Group discussed different ways of preparing appliqué pieces, including: using freezer paper on top; needleturning, using freezer paper on the bottom and basting or ironing the seam allowances down; using mylar in conjunction with spray sizing; and using a hera marker and foamboard. The group also spent time discussing next year's Baltimore Album theme and viewing a slew of wonderful Baltimore Album blocks brought in by **Judy Mayer and Mary Waterman.** We were fortunate to be joined by Nancy Kerns, who was the featured speaker at the April meeting. A large number of the Hand Applique Group members reconvened the next day at the Katonah Library for the wonderful workshop that Nancy led. In May, the Hand Applique Group will be bringing in the blocks they have done during the past year and we will be talking about setting options and borders.

**Dear Jane Group** - On Saturday, April 17, our second meeting, we discussed different methods of preparing shapes for appliqué and different ways to print out the block patterns for templates, overlays and foundation piecing patterns. The May meeting will take place on Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup> at 10 am at The Apple Bank for Savings, 666 Columbus Avenue, Thornwood, New York. It will focus on paper piecing. Anyone who hasn't signed up yet but would like to join can just send me an email.

**Kids Can Quilt** – Members of this group have been busy assembling and quilting the quilt blocks made by the first graders at Katonah Elementary School in March. The quilts also will be hand-tied by the children. The four finished quilts will be displayed at the Guild's meeting in May and will then be donated to the Friends of Karen. 
