The American Museum of Folk Art in NYC has declared they will feature "Year of the Quilt" related exhibits, starting October 5 with 35 quilts at their 53rd street location. On May 10 they will open a second exhibit there. Beginning November 16 at their location near Lincoln Center, they will feature the role of stars in quilts. Great topic for a Guild called Northern Star.

Recently a Bloomingdales catalog advertised a new offering, the Quilting B, an area where they will be featuring handmade quilts of "Americana with a modern spirit." They enthuse that "quilts are one of the hottest must-haves for fall. Perfect at the foot of a bed – or at the back of a sofa."

Joining the same theme, the Pottery Barn catalog featured their Museum Craft Collection. "We're proud to introduce partnerships with some of the finest museums in America. In collaboration with the American Folk Art Museum, the Gee's Bend Foundation and the Shelburne Museum, we're bringing you re-creations of historic pieces that celebrate our country's past.... The hand of the artist – Gee's Bend Quilts, recreated historic pieces, close replicas of original pieces, hand quilted using the same technique, similar fabrics and the same dimensions. Log Cabin, Housetop Variation. Basket Weave."

Museums and merchants are recognizing quilts for their beauty and their history. Quilters find themselves in a popular place today. How lucky we are to be creating something we enjoy and value, while sharing the experience with others.
