Our speaker this month is **Frieda Anderson** from Elgin, IL. Frieda is an art quilter and is well known for her original designs using her own hand -dyed fabrics. In her slide presentation Frieda will show us her step-by-step process of gradation dying featured in her new book, *Fabric to Dye For*. Her website: www.friestyle.com

The Guild Invitational will include red-and-white traditional-pieced, Hawaiian applique, and art quilt styles. All quilts will be displayed at the 2012 World of Quilts show. There will be no judging or voting. Click here for details and join the fun.

People are already putting their thoughts together on how to answer this invitation, following its size and category requirements. Our Guild President cautions us to remember that the color red has a tendency to run (bleed) and thus to take the time to prepare our fabric before starting the project. How to deal with red thread is another issue and it might be worthwhile to test its color-safety by running a stitching line.
